The Conference will take place at the Congress Center of Aldemar Knossos Royal Village in the resort town of Hersonissos, close to Heraklion, the main city of the Greek Island of Crete. Crete was the center of the Minoan civilization, which flourished at about 2000 B.C. There are many archaeological sites throughout the island, with the palace of Knossos being the most well known.

How to get there?

From the International Airport of Heraklion :

Aldemar Knossos Royal Village is situated 23 Km east to the International Airport of Heraklion and can be easily reached by taxi (stand is located just outside the airport arrival hall), at the approximate cost of € 25,00. Supplemental charges may apply for luggage.

From the Port of Heraklion:

Aldemar Knossos Royal Village is situated 25 Km east to the port of Heraklion, and can be reached again by taxi (stand is located just outside the Arrival hall), at the approximate cost of € 25,00. Supplemental charges apply for luggage.

Alternatively you may walk to the Public Bus Station located within walking distance from the port and get on a Public Bus (named KTEL in Greek), direction: *Hersonissos*. Departures are scheduled every half hour with the first bus departing at 06:30 and the last one at 21:30.

By Rent-a-Car:

All major rent-a-car companies (Avis, Hertz, etc) are located at the arrival hall of the International Airport and the port of Heraklion. Bookings can be made through the local administrative agent (Triaena Tours, *see Att. "A"*).

Registration, , will take place at the Aldemar Knossos Royal Village on Monday **23 April 2007** (starting 08.00) prior to the opening of the Symposium and through the day.

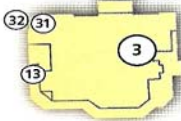

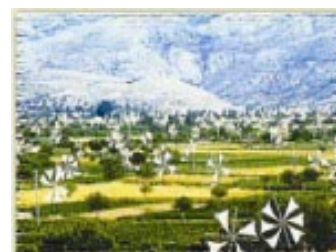
There will be the following programs for accompanying partners:

The mythical birthplace of Zeus, the cave of Psycho with its stalactites and stalagmites is the last stop before returning to the hotels in the afternoon

- **Wednesday 25th April 2007: Central Crete Tour Half Day Tour**



Enjoy a tour to the heart of Crete visiting the villages known for the traditional pottery, the Wineries where you will sample the local wine from the famous vineyards and passing by the places that myths, once lived. Crete is an island of contrasts. Cosmopolitan and over-developed in some parts, rough and unspoiled in others. The scenery in the interior is constantly changing. You may find harsh and barren land as well as lush wooded areas. You will depart from the Aldemar Knossos Royal Village and head for the hillside villages renowned throughout Crete as the place for traditional pottery workshops and still producing-pitharia-traditional storage jars, little changed from the Minoan era. Watch the local potters at work and admire their

wares. Continue on to villages which have been the center of one of the most important wine growing areas of Crete since Minoan times. See the traditional vineyards and visit the winery before sampling some of the local products.

7. TECHNICAL VISIT Visit to Knossos

The Technical Visit will take place on Wednesday afternoon 25th of April 2007. Departure time will be approximately **16.00 hrs** from the Aldemar Knossos Royal Village by bus. Afterwards, buses will take the participants attending the Gala Dinner to its venue, while all other participants not attending the dinner will be transferred back to the Aldemar Knossos Royal Village.



Knossos, an important city in antiquity, which was inhabited continuously from the Neolithic period until the 5th century AD, is situated at the southern part of Heraklion. The Minoan palace is the main site of interest here. According to tradition, it was the seat of the wise king Minos. The Palace of Knossos is connected with thrilling legends, such as the myth of the Labyrinth, with the Minotaur, and the story of Daidalos and Ikaros.

The earliest traces of inhabitation in the area of the palace go back to the Neolithic period (7000-3000) BC). The first palace built at Knossos was destroyed, probably by an earthquake, about 1700 BC. A second, larger palace was built on the ruins of the old one. This was partially destroyed about 1450BC, after which the Mycenaeans established themselves at Knossos. The palace was eventually destroyed in about 1350 BC by a major conflagration. The reconstruction of the Palace of Knossos was carried out by the excavator, Sir Arthur Evans.



8. CITY & COUNTRY INFORMATION

Crete

The island of Crete is the largest of the Greek islands, with a total area of 8.336km².

Crete has around nine thousand years of fascinating history, rich in events and periods of turbulence, with its Minoan Civilization, Byzantine rule, Saracen pirates raids, Venetian rule, Ottoman domination and revolutions, culminating in its unification with the rest of Greece less than a century ago. Crete is well known for its



natural beauty and impressive mountain ranges, ravines, long stretches of beach leading into deep blue seas, numerous smaller islands, plateaus and fertile plains. The island also hosts over 100 different species of flowers and herbs which are unique in Crete.

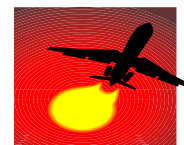
Its special cuisine stems back from the Minoan period, to modern trend of Mediterranean diet. In all aspects of life, its people bring another dimension to conviviality, festivities and daily routine. Crete is home to many poets, as well as endless satirical and laudatory four line couplet poems, set to the mandolin or lyre, and wonderful a capella music of its streets and hostelryes. The journey round Crete has many different facets and traditions which continue through time and provide a source of fascination for the visitor.

HOW TO REACH CRETE

Even though Crete is an island, it is not at all isolated from the rest of Greece. Through its ports and airports it offers all the transport possibilities throughout the year.

By Air

Daily flights with Olympic Airways & Aegean Airlines, connect the Heraklion and the Chania Airport with the Athens International Airport throughout the year. In addition to the local flights, the two cities are connected with all major European capitals through direct charter flights. The flight from Athens to Crete is approximately 40 minutes.



By Boat



The Cretans have one of the finest fleets of ferries that travel overnight. MINOAN LINES and ANEK LINES connect Heraklion Rethimno, and Chania with the Port of Pireas on a daily basis. The trip by boat lasts approximately a night, with the last daily boats leaving in the afternoon (around 21:00) and arriving early in the morning. Modern cabins are available for the travellers to spend the night.

9. CLIMATE

Crete straddles two climatic zones, the Mediterranean and the North African, mainly falling within the former. As such, the climate in Crete is primarily temperate. The atmosphere can be quite humid, depending on the proximity to the sea. The winter is fairly mild. Snow fall is practically unknown to the plains, but quite frequent in the mountains. During summer, average temperatures are in the high 20's-low 30's (Celsius). The exception can be the south coast, including the Messara plain and Asterousia mountains, which fall in the North African climatic zone and thus enjoys significantly more sunny days and high temperatures during the summer. Probably the best time to visit Crete is spring and autumn.

10. CURRENCY

Since January 2002, the new currency in Greece as in many other European countries is Euro. Bank notes are issued in denominations of 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500 Euro. One Euro equals 100 Eurocents, and coins come in 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 50 Eurocents as well as 1 and 2 Euro denominations.

Please note that prices indicated, are including taxes and service. Tipping is at your discretion and only when you're very happy with the service.

Credit Cards: Most shops and hotels accept major international credit cards such as Visa, Diners, Mastercard and American Express.

12. MISCELLANEOUS

Languages

Among European languages, English are widely spoken in Greece, especially among youth. French and German are also commonly used. The latter, however, is also widely spoken in Crete. In general, one shall not face serious language barriers while in restaurants, hotels cafés and other tourist areas.

Meeting Attire

Meeting participants should wear business attire.

Electricity

220Volt - 50 Hz. If you wish to use your own personal electrical appliances, an adaptor is necessary for participants used to other voltages. If you need more help you may contact the reception of the Aldemar Knossos Royal Village.

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Taxis

Taxis can be stopped virtually at any place of Crete by just standing at the edge of the pavement and waiving your hand. Alternatively, you can stand at a taxi station (where applicable). At the hotel, you may contact the Concierge or the Front Desk for a taxi call.

All taxes in Greece have a specific colour, depending on the region. For example, taxis in Athens are yellow, in Thessaloniki are Bordeaux and in Crete **light grey**. However, all official taxis have on top of the roof an illuminated panel with the word "TAXI". Illegal taxis are virtually unknown in Greece.

There is a starting price for each ride (which depends on the time of day). If you go outside of the city limits, the rate increases.

Emergency

You may dial 100 to reach the police. For ambulance services, you may dial 166. For Fire Brigade dial 199. All these numbers are operating on a 24-hour basis. In case of any emergency at hotel, always contact the Front Desk.

Time zone

The time in Greece is UTC/GMT + 2 hours during winter time. All clocks are shifted one hour ahead (summer time), usually around the last Sunday of April. Winter time is again restored at the last Sunday of October. Recently in the EU, there are talks about waiving this energy saving system and follow instead a flat timing all around the year.

In Crete you may find the famous Raki, Kaltsounia and Ntakos

Famous Cretan Raki

Every autumn after grape harvest, various wine festivities begin throughout Greece. A few days later, in Thessaly, Epirus, Macedonia and on the island of Crete the "Celebration of Tsipouro" takes place.



Tsipouro is a strong distilled spirit containing approximately 37 per cent alcohol per volume and is produced from the must-residue of the wine-press. The name tsipouro is used throughout the country, except for Crete, where the same spirit with a *stronger aroma* is known as **tsikoudia**. Also the Oriental name **raki** is used, from which the term "rakizio" is derived, used to refer to the drink's distillation process, which usually turns into a huge celebration among family, friends and neighbours.

TRADITIONAL CRETAN RECIPE

KALTSOUNIA WITH CINNAMON

There are various versions of Kaltsounia. Cretan Kaltsounia are also shaped in stars like in the picture. Our effort to shape them like stars was unfortunate as you may notice. The difference from the proposal in the recipe is that instead of making a half moon you roll the circled dough up, down and left, right of the filling and then squeeze the dough in order to shape a star.



INGREDIENTS

- 1 1/2 c Fresh mizithra or ricotta
- 2 c All-purpose flour
- 2 tb Grated hard ricotta
 - 1 pn Salt
 - 2 eggs; separated
 - 1 ts Vanilla extract
 - 1/2 c Granulated sugar
 - Confectioners' sugar
 - 2 tb Butter; melted
 - tb Milk (or more)

METHOD

For the filling, combine the cheeses, lightly beaten egg yolks, sugar, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, and melted butter in a bowl. The mixture should be thick enough to mound, but not stiff; add 1 tablespoon milk, if necessary. Set aside while you make the dough. Sift the flour and salt into a bowl, then cut in the butter and mix by rubbing between your fingers. Mix in the vanilla, egg whites, and enough milk to make a soft dough. Knead until smooth and elastic, then break off

small pieces and roll as thin of a dime. (The dough will be elastic and can be rolled easily.) Cut into circles 4-inches in diameter (teacup size), then on each circle place a teaspoon of the cheese filling. Wet the circle edge with water or milk and fold over to form a half-moon, then seal with the tines of a fork or pastry wheel. Arrange the Kaltsounia on buttered cookie sheets and bake in a moderate oven (350 F) for 25 minutes, or until the pastry puffs up and turns a light chestnut color. Remove from the oven, and place on racks, and dust with confectioners' sugar and cinnamon. Serve hot or cold.

CRETAN RUSK WITH TOMATO, OREGANO AND CHEESE - (KRITIKOS DAKOS)



Dakos is a kind of rusk, made with barley flour. This appetizer is a speciality of Crete, served also as an appetizer in many Athenian restaurants. This recipe yields one item

INGREDIENTS

- *One barley rusk*
- *1 fresh tomato, peeled and crushed*
- *oregano for seasoning*
- *Small piece of soft mizithra cheese or feta cheese*
- *olive oil*

METHOD

Soak the rusk in water. Some people avoid this step and let the rusk soak with the tomato juice, which is poured over it. Pour the crushed tomato with its juice over the rusk. If the juice is too much add as much as you like and waste the rest of the tomato. Pour some olive oil and as a topping add some grated mizithra cheese or crumbled feta cheese. Season with oregano and serve.
